Broad Guidelines

The Honour Roll has been set up to recognise people who have made a significant contribution to the Neighbourhood House and Learning Centre (NH&LC) sector through their work which has state wide implications, has been undertaken at a state, regional, network or individual House/Centre level and which reflects the community development philosophy, principles and practice of the sector. Confirmation of the inductees will be announced at the annual ANHLC Conference dinner as a means of celebrating these achievements with the sector as a whole.

A Member organisation may nominate as many people as they consider worthy of nomination; each nomination must be seconded by a different Member organisation.

Selection criteria

The recipient must have done significant work for the NH&LC sector that:

- has had a beneficial effect for Houses and Centres throughout the whole state, or has had a beneficial effect in a regional NH Network, which has resulted in state-wide application.
- reflects the community development philosophy, principles and practice of the sector; and
- has been undertaken from within the sector at the state, regional, network or individual House/Centre level.

Please note that this is not a long-service award and current ANHLC Board or staff members are not eligible for nomination.
